Hagerman Section/Snake River

This beautiful high desert section of the Snake River offers plenty of whitewater excitement. Our guides are very knowledgeable on the history of the river and the surrounding area.

Idaho is well known for its amazing geology and this river section offers spectacular examples of how the Snake River cuts through Southern Idaho. Wildlife and waterfowl are abundant along the river corridor. Natural springs from the Snake River Aquifer flow into the river. This half day trip is great for ages 6 and up.

Meeting Place: Lower Salmon Falls Dam

Trip Times: 10:30 am with riverside lunch – 3:30 pm with no food service

Approximate trip length: 3.5 hours. All trips require a reservation.

Banbury to Thousand Springs/Snake River

Paddle your own watercraft with a guide down the Snake River. The Thousand Springs section offers a flat water paddle with an easy down river current. There is an array of beautiful waterfowl and birds of prey to admire.

On this trip you will pass by Box Springs Canyon, paddle into Blue Heart Springs, and adventure around Ritter Island. This is a wonderful way to experience the Snake River up close and personal. Recommended for ages 10 and up.

Centennial Park Scenic Motor Boat Tours

Double your fun and add beach camping to your trip with our overnight excursion. This canyon trip offers class III/ IV rapids with stunning white beaches perfect for a game of beach bocce. If you are looking for a full adventure, the Lower Salmon Gorge four and five day trip will fulfill your summer vacation rafting dream. This exciting class III/ IV whitewater section offers plenty of time to fish, hike, and swim. The trip ends in Hells Canyon on the Snake River. Raft out or ask about the option to jet boat to Pittsburg Landing. Call our office for information and dates.

BILLINGSLEY CREEK LODGING

Billingsley Creek Lodging, located one mile North of Hagerman, Idaho, offers year round lodging. The five rooms and five cabins all sit with views of the beautiful natural spring known as Billingsley Creek. Blue Heron, ducks, birds of prey, beavers, and muskrats make up some of the wildlife that live on the property. Billingsley Creek is an oasis in Southern Idaho's high desert with plenty of green grass and shade trees to relax under. For our registered guests we have a barbecue area with picnic tables and fire pit available Memorial Weekend through Labor Day.

Billingsley Creek Lodging is a very unique property. We have a maximum occupancy number of 26 people per day, this allows our guests to enjoy the property and creek without feeling crowded.

Billingsley Creek does not allow pets on the property or in the rooms/cabins

Safety

Safety first is our rule. We realize everyone has a different idea of adventure so we have designed our trips from "Mild to Wild". Our guides are all trained in whitewater boating skills, emergency care, and river rescue techniques. All are licensed and bonded by the State of Idaho and all carry first aid credentials. Your safety is our first priority.

River Ratings

Class I: Moving water with few riffles and small waves. Few or no obstructions.

Class II: Easy rapids with waves up to 3 feet and wide, clear channels that are obvious without scouting. Some maneuvering is required.

Class III: Rapids with high, irregular waves often capable of swamping an open canoe. Narrow passages that often require complex maneuvering. May require shore scouting.

Class IV: Long, difficult rapids with constricted passages that often require precise maneuvering in turbulent waters. Scouting from shore is often necessary. Conditions make rescue difficult.

Class V: Extremely difficult, long, and very violent rapids with highly congested routes that almost always must be scouted from shore. Rescue conditions are difficult and there is significant hazard to life in the event of a mishap.

Class VI: Difficulties of Class V carried to the extreme of navigability. Nearly impossible and very dangerous. For teams of experts only after close study.
